The scholarly pursuits involving the edition, publication, and analysis of Ottoman texts are in the midst of a revolution caused by the increasing introduction of computers and electronic text technologies into these endeavors at every level. Serious editing and text-analysis projects employing computers are already underway in this country and are soon to begin in Turkey. If this revolution is allowed to proceed in a haphazard manner, a great deal of effort will be wasted and a field which could benefit immensely will be unecessarily stunted. The purpose of this workshop is to provide a forum for scholars from North America and Turkey to come together and initiate a dialog on some of the most pressing issues in the field. Among these issues would be:

- Standards for transcription and representation of Ottoman characters.
- Standards for the representation of Ottoman phonology and grammatical endings.
- Spelling and hyphenation conventions.
- The use of computers and computer archives in the process of editing texts.
- Computer techniques to facilitate the publication of Ottoman primary sources.

These are crucial issues that will be discussed by a group of scholars who are in the forefront of the field in the employment of computer technology.



In order to allow you to reflect on the issues that will be raised in the MESA workshop on *The Impact of Computer Technology on the Edition of Ottoman Texts*, I have prepared the following list of discussion topics. If you have other issues that are important to your thinking or work, please let me know and I will produce a revised outline for the actual workshop.

- 1. The technical problems of integrating computers into the process of editing.
  - a. Text preparation, including mark-up, the use of *SGML*, typesetting.
  - b. Standardization of editing technology: transcription and the "read-back question, treatment of text variation, etc.
- 2. The values and limitations of editing methods using computers.
- 3. What in the Turkish Studies tradition/system supports the capacity to do such work? Are we producing scholars capable of doing the work? How can we begin to produce capable scholars in less than a hit-or-miss manner?
- 4. How are we going to support scholars in this endeavor? Whom are we going to support? How are we going to enhance the possibilities for cooperation, standardization, and communication among potential editors?
